4.1 Description of first aid measures

- Contact with eyes

If substance has got into eyes, immediately wash out with plenty of water for several minutes Irrigate eyes thoroughly whilst lifting eyelids

Remove contact lenses, if present and easy to do. Continue rinsing.

If eye irritation persists: Get medical advice/attention.

- Contact with skin

Wash affected area with plenty of soap and water

Take off contaminated clothing and wash it before reuse.

If skin irritation occurs: Get medical advice/attention.

Flush spill area with copious amounts of water
